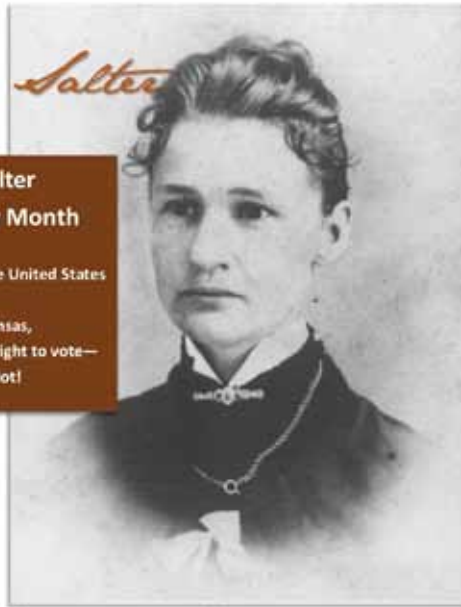
Patricia Middleton presents the story of
